From the Vicar

A while back a house I had lived in for two years ended being renovated on a series of *The Block NZ*. I confess I got quite invested in the show for that season. It was a little bit like being part of it; watching a place that was so familiar to me get torn apart and rebuilt. That was at least until the team renovating my old place made a series of shocking design decisions (does a small townhouse really need a butler's pantry?). I was left thinking I was lucky to have lived in the house in its pre-renovation, rundown state rather than its supposedly improved form.

If you don't know *The Block*, you might still be familiar with the basic genre of "reality" TV competitions. There seems little else on TV – sometimes even the same show for days on end. I assume this is because there is an insatiable demand for programmes showing people trying to cook a meal and then getting yelled at. Yelling, fighting and back-biting do seem to be the staples of this particular form of TV.

Presumably this is all great entertainment but I wonder if it is really the culture that we wish to be building. A study by two British academics, called *Belligerent Broadcasting*, suggested that reality TV had ushered in an "age of spite" that can now be seen in politics and public discourse.

Reading an article this week, I was reminded of the reverse. Of how God's intention is that the life of the Church, the life of Christians lived in the hope of Jesus, is meant to be its own reality show. One that reveals a different culture, the culture of heaven and not of earth:

The kingdom of Jesus operates as an upside-down economy. The first are last, the weak are strong, and the troubled are blessed. This way of life is hard to imagine. It is very different from our way of life. However, as members of Christ's body, unified to Him and each other, we participate in that upside-down economy. We no longer live for what we can take from others; we give abundantly. We no longer look for the ugly in our neighbour; we stubbornly seek their good... We live this way because we have been "raised with Christ". Our hope empowers us to pursue Christ's kingdom way of life here on earth, as it is in heaven.
